## **Programme Notes**

Erich Wolfgang Korngold composed his Violin Concerto in D major, Op. 35, in 1945.

## Movements:

- I. Moderato nobile: The violin solo which opens the concerto is a theme from *Another Dawn*(1937), running over two octaves in five notes. *Juarez* (1939) provided the second theme (the Maximilian & Carlotta theme), more expansive and reliant upon the orchestra.
- **II. Romance**: The solo violin introduces the principal theme of the slow movement, quoted from *Anthony Adverse* (1936) and revisited after a contrasting middle section that seems to have been uniquely composed for the concerto.
- III. Finale: The most demanding movement for the soloist begins with a staccato jig, which leads to a second theme based like the first on the main motif from *The Prince and the Pauper* (1937) and builds up to a virtuoso climax.
